- Student must be admitted by March 1st and confirm by May 1st to remain eligible for their Raise Me awards (these awards may be subsumed by the Titan scholarships).

March 1st

Online Scholarship Application Submission Deadline

- Admitted students must complete the Online Scholarship Application by March 1st in order to become eligible for more than 200 scholarships.

March 1st - May 1st

Confirm admission

- Students must be admitted by March 1st to remain eligible for admission-based scholarships (Titan Onsite, Silver and Gold and Raise Me).
- Students remain eligible for the Honors Program scholarship and any scholarship awarded via the Online Scholarship Application, as well as the Chancellor Merit Scholarship and Midwest Student Exchange Program fee remission up to the start of fall classes (August 22).
- Admitted students must confirm by May 1st in order to secure admission-based scholarships.
- Students can confirm their intention to enroll by calling, sending an email, or online.

April 15th (for 2022-23 school year)

FAFSA priority deadline

- for FULL consideration of both state and federal funds

Faculty and students recognized for commitment to advancing MLK legacy

IU South Bend faculty and students were recently honored with awards from Indiana University for exemplifying Dr. Martin Luther King Jr's legacy.

Darryl Heller, director of the IU South Bend Civil Rights Heritage Center and women's and gender studies professor, and student Ivory Woods were named as 2022 Building Bridges award winners. This award honors Indiana University faculty, staff, students, alumni, and community partners across IU's campuses who capture King's spirit, vision, and leadership. As director of the Civil Rights Heritage Center, a learning center housed at the former site of a segregated city pool, Darryl is working to advance the center's mission to educate the community of past and present civil rights and social justice issues in order to create a brighter future for all. "It is an honor to be thought of as walking in the footsteps of Dr. King. I am especially inspired by his continuous growth and development. The King who wrote that it was time to break the silence in 1967 was a more mature and battle-tested person than the one who spoke about his dream in 1963. I hope that I continue to have the courage to speak truth to power, as King did, even when it is unpopular or misunderstood," says Darryl.

IU South Bend's New Palliative and Supportive Care Minor is First in the Area

The new palliative and supportive care minor in the Vera Z. Dwyer College of Health Sciences at IU South Bend is the first minor of its kind in the area. The minor was established to introduce palliative care education at undergraduate level, broaden the scope of people educated in palliative care, and address the workforce shortage in that field.

"Palliative care is not hospice care," explains Bunmi Okanlami, MD, MBA, Vera Z. Dwyer Bicentennial Chair of Palliative Care and clinical assistant professor of health sciences. "Palliative care is broader than hospice care. It is comprehensive care of a person of any age and at any stage of a serious illness. Ideally it should be introduced soon after a diagnosis is made. Hospice care is palliative care at the end of life."

Mayor's Presidential Bid Inspires IU South Bend Professor to Produce Film

A distinctive time in South Bend, when the national media spotlight was on the city during former Mayor Pete Buttigieg's presidential campaign, inspired Associate Professor of Sociology and Anthropology Zachary Schrank to create the film documentary ***Big Enough, Small Enough – South Bend in Transition.***

"As the national media was profiling Mayor Pete's role in South Bend," explained Schrank, "I felt like it was an appropriate time as locals to create and document an oral history of South Bend, merging local and national issues."

Weekday Tours: Every Friday at 1:00 PM and 3:00 PM

Self-Guided Tours: If students want to experience campus in-person but can't make one of the above guided tours or prefer to not be in a group at this time, they can take a self-guided tour of the University. Participants can use a mobile device to access the tour guide and follow along with the text as they make their way around campus. We also have printed versions of the self-guided tour available for pick up during office hours for those that need them.

Virtual 360° Campus Tour: While learning about campus and our offerings, students can interact with the panoramas by using their mouse to click and drag around the scene. The mouse's scroll wheel can be used to zoom in and out as well.

Admission Counselors from IU South Bend are working with high schools in the Michiana area to make on-site admission decisions for students either virtually or in person.
